## Zeta Day on the Hill

On Wednesday, September 19, 2012 Soror Pauline Gibson, and a van load of New Jersey Sorors from Epsilon Xi Zeta Chapter, ventured off from Trenton, NJ to Washington D.C to meet our Grand Basileus, First Anti Basileus, Second Anti Basileus, several other National, Regional and State Officers as well as over 200 Sorors on Capitol Hill.

The day was bright, sunny and beautiful and the City was covered with pure royal blue. It was a great sight to see especially when we gathered on the steps of the hill for picture taking.

Soror Krysta Jones our own Social Action Coordinator did a fantastic job organizing the events of the day. She further provided us with the summary of what took place on Capitol Hill. She shared that Sorors came from across the nation to Capitol Hill to learn about key issues affecting our communities, explore opportunities for national partnerships, and network with experts and advocates. The following is a summary of the day.

**Women in Politics**-Katherine Gilmore, legislative aide for Philadelphia City Councilwoman Blondell Richards Brown, moderated a discussion with Stefanie Reeves, lobbyist for the American Psychological Association. Stefanie discussed her experiences lobbying for associations over the past 10 years. Stefanie stressed the importance of doing your research

as citizen lobbyists conveying your message to Congress.

**An Insider's Perspective to Campaigns and Elections**-Marcus Mason, president of the Washington Government Relations Group and board member of the Congressional Black Caucus Foundation discussed his experiences serving as a Capitol Hill staffer and campaign manager. He provided an overview of the political process and how to best get involved in campaigns.

**Voting Rights** -Jotaka Eaddy of the NAACP discussed how voter ID laws around the nation are expected to decrease the number of people who are able to participate in the electoral process, specifically minorities, elderly, and low-income Americans. It is particularly important that we get more people registered to vote and to the polls on Election Day, and oppose voter ID laws at the state level.

**The Impact of the Election on Women's Health**-Moderated by Atlantic Regional Director Janet Bivins, this interactive panel featured representatives from the National Partnership on Women and Families and the American Congress of Obstetricians and Gynecologists to review various threats to reproductive health around the nation.

**Zetas Taking the Lead**-National Social Action Director Krysta Jones moderated a discussion with Zeta members the Honorable Sherrin Alsop, Chair of the Board of Supervisors in King and Queen County, VA, and Monica Reid, chair of the Northern Virginia Coalition. Panelists focused on the importance of being involved in your community, following the legacy of Zeta Phi Beta being a community-conscious, action-oriented organization. They stressed social action and community leadership being a natural progression from our ZHOPE and other service partnerships.

**ZHOPE on the Hill** -International president Mary B. Wright brought together experts on many programs addressed through ZHOPE and other sorority initiatives. The National Park Service, the Fish and Wildlife Service, the Senate Committee on Health Education, Labor, and Pensions and AG Health Strategies stressed innovative ways to promote healthy living through ZHOPE including partnerships, outdoor activities, and President Wright's Adopt-A-School initiative as a way to combat bullying.

The month of September continued with a joint effort for Voter Registration with our brothers of the Kappa Upsilon Sigma Chapter at the Moorestown Mall in Moorestown NJ which was held on September 29<sup>th</sup> 2012. We successfully collected **11** voter registration applications and handed out **5** additional applications.
